WOUNDED SOLDIERS PASS THROUGH DERBY.

DERBY MAN ON HOSPITAL TRAIN.

Among about 150 wounded soldiers in one of the Midland Railway hospital trains, which, travelling from Southampton for the North, passed through Derby this afternoon, was a Derby man, Private E. Conway, of the Cheshire Regiment. He was wounded in the right arm in the fighting at La Bassee, and his wife, who lives at 145, Siddals Road, and other relatives and friends, chatted with him during the brief period the train stopped. Cigarettes and tobacco were freely distributed by people who chanced to be on the platform, and the welcome gifts were cordially acknowledged. Several members of a Scottish regiment were aboard, and one of them displayed a German helmet which he had secured. Those who were more seriously wounded and lay on stretchers, waved their hands in response to the cheers which were given when the train departed for Sheffield, where some of the men were to be received.
